February 15, 2013 Legislative Update: With Sequestration Looming, Congress Hears from Biomedical Research Community

With the threat of mandatory across-the-board spending cuts to NIH and other discretionary programs just days away, the research community continued to take our message to Congress that it adopt a more balanced approach to deficit reduction before sequestration is implemented March 1. ASPET co-signed a letter by the Nondefense Discretionary (NDD) United that was sent to all Members of Congress and the White House. The letter urges them to support a balanced approach to deficit reduction that does not include additional cuts to discretionary programs...

FDA Commissioner Highlights Sequestration's Impact on Agency

In a February 6, 2013 article in the *Drug Industry Daily*, the FDA addresses sequestration as FDA Commissioner Margaret Hamburg hints that the agency is taking measures to prepare for the possibility of its enactment. 
Celebrate the Life of Peter Dews
